





THE FESTIVAL

Introduction: Over the last two decades economic development and globalization have resulted in apparent progress and increased opportunity, but has also brought some problems in its wake like the loss of history, culture, ecology, roots, traditional arts, folk arts and language. After much deliberation it was decided to have a celebration in honour of our cultural and natural heritage.

Objectives:

- To revive traditional performing arts in the temple precincts
- To disseminate knowledge from our vedic texts and Mahakavyas like Ramayana and Mahabharatha, Bhagavatha, Bhagavadgeetha and many more.
- To create a forum that will give easy access to art forms for the common man
- To disseminate knowledge of the significance of cultural symbolism and practices.
- To conduct many more temple festivals across the state
- To bring understanding of our heritage, culture and the relation between man and environment through well thought out themes.

People of this culture relate simultaneously to the Supreme Godhead whether in sacred spaces within the temples, in the Yaaga Shalas, in the elements, in trees, animals, rivers, mountains, in all of nature, nay in all creation and without any confusion. The approach in the Indian ethos is one that is holistic and all-encompassing.



The venues for the festival are Sacred Heritage spaces. Temples are a creation of our open culture that recognises and understands the diversity of people's approach to the Supreme and the understanding of the Divinity of all creation.

It has been found that one of the best paths to sensitising people to country, culture and community is through the performing arts especially the traditional classical arts where the content is spiritual and peace giving.

Performing arts, architecture, visual arts, literature, poetry, knowledge dissemination, environment and ecology were all a part of this temple culture.

Bengaluru is home to beautiful temples some as old as 1200 years and Gudiya Sambhrama is an earnest attempt to revive this multi-faceted culture in temples today..

The resource person for any Heritage activity comes from the best of scholars, artists, academicians, naturalists and others.

Much research and work goes into creating thematic posters for display at the venues. Trees and plants are decorated and displayed with information boards.

A thematic display of sacred plants and flowering plants with details were presented in collaboration with B E S T Innovation University for Gudiya Sambhrama 2022.







"Gudiya Sambhrama...The Temple Festival" has been conducted annually for over a decade and in 2022 the temple festival celebrated its thirteenth edition dedicated to "Kaala, Kala and Kavya".

Gudiya Sambhrama 2022 was held on the weekends from March 26th 2022 in sacred spaces in Basavanagudi, Hanumanthanagar, Gavipuram, Banashankari, Malleswaram, Koramangala, HSR Layout and Domlur.

The striking feature of this year's temple festival was "Divya Varna" an exhibition of traditional art and a whole day dedicated to the Parayanam of Sri Vedanta Desikan,

Apart from the main stage performances artists performed inside each of the 18 temples as part of the sangeetha and nrithya upachara to the Supreme.

Nrithya kainkaryam was organized on 26th and 27th of March 2022 in all the 18 temples across Bengaluru where Gudiya Sambhrama is celebrated every year. Students of well-known dance schools of the city Raadhakalpa Dance school, Amrthavarshini Academy of Dance and Chithkala School of dance, offered their worship through their dance to the supreme. The artistes found this offering inspiring and soul elevating.

This was one of the highlights of the utsava to bring back the devopacharas in the temple as this practice is slowly fading away..

Entry was free to all concerts, kainkaryas and temple Pujas of the temple festival.



Behind the Scenes:

A spacious stage was erected in the venue taking care to make it sturdy and smooth for the dancers. Artistically designed platforms were placed for the musicians.

The best of sound and lighting was arranged for every programme. Generators were organized for an uninterrupted power supply during the performances.

Heritage took all the measures to take care of the outstation artists and their hospitality. Hotels and Service apartments were booked in advance to make the artists comfortable and food was arranged according to their requirements.

Transport was arranged for their arrival and departures and also to the programme venue.

All artists including their Gurus present during the recitals, were blessed with divine chantings by the Pradhana Archakas while they were given mementos by Heritage.

Memento to all the artists and chief guests was a 'Tulsi Plant', A book on spirituality and life, fragrant incense sticks in a cotton bag to convey the message—"Avoid plastics"

Hand-outs were printed on recycled brown paper with the images of a temple bell with the entire schedule and write-up of the festival.




Nrithya Kainkaryam



















Katha Gana Samarpana




We started at 6.30 am and chanted all his 28 devotional poems, the chanting brought much peace and gave great energy to all.
